Dr Ryabinin is an oceanographer, climatologist, marine engineer, and emeritus meteorologist of the Russian Federation. His research was marked by several prominent achievements in the medium range weather prediction, marine services, offshore projects, and climate research. Dr Ryabinin has been a part of the design team for the research and development initiative “United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030)”. It has been proclaimed by the United Nations to support efforts to reverse the cycle of decline in ocean health and gather ocean stakeholders worldwide behind a common framework that will ensure ocean science can fully support countries in creating improved conditions for sustainable development of the Ocean. Adaptation strategies and science-informed policy

responses to global change are urgently needed. Scientific understanding of the ocean’s responses to pressures and management action is fundamental for sustainable development. As mandated by the UN General Assembly, the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC) of UNESCO will coordinate the Decade’s preparatory process, inviting the global ocean community to plan for the next ten years in ocean science and technology to deliver, together, the ocean we need for the future we want!
